Accommodations: Hotel accommodations have been carefully selected and inspected to meet and maintain the standards of comfort, cleanliness and customer service that we require, and you deserve. Please note air conditioning is not a standard feature in European hotels and restaurants. Those that offer air conditioning may not produce the amount of cool air that you are accustomed to at home. Additionally, room size amenities and configurations will vary from the United States. The hotels do not provide king-size beds. Queen-size beds consist of two single beds pushed together. Some hotels may have coffee makers, hair dryers, irons and ironing boards available. Amadeus cabin amenities include an in-room safe and hairdryer.

Amadeus Audio System: All shore excursions include the use of a Quietvox easy to use wireless Amadeus Audio System. The receiver can be worn around the neck and the headphones allow you to hear your tour guide's explanations.

Currency: Currency in the countries through which you travel:

- Austria Euro (EUR)

Currency exchange rates fluctuate on a daily basis. A helpful website for referencing current rates is www.oanda.com.

Cruise Ship Clothing: There is not a specific dress code aboard the Amadeus fleet, but we recommend that you dress smartly for dinner and for special occasions (semi-formal or smart casual). By day and for the shore excursions we recommend you wear light clothing and comfortable shoes and also take with you a pullover or jacket for cooler evenings. Flat rubber-soled walking shoes are recommended for onboard the river boat.

Docking Etiquette: European river waterways are not large enough to support large docks, often making it necessary for riverboats to tie up alongside one another, called "rafting." In order for passengers to disembark in these instances, it is necessary to walk across other ships in order to reach shore.

Electrical Current: The electric current in Europe is 220 volts, 50 cycles. Electric outlets and plugs are different from those in North America. An adapter is required to plug your device into an electrical socket. However, a voltage converter is only required if your device is not compatible with 220 volts. Check the voltage of any device that you are thinking of bringing. If the tag on your device lists 110-220 volts, then you will not need a converter. Adapters and converters are available at luggage, department, and electronics stores.

Electricity on board all Amadeus ships is 220 volts, 50 cycles. We suggest using a 2-pin adapter for 110V appliances. Please note that for safety reasons it is not permitted to use flat irons and similar equipment in the cabins.

Gratuities Aboard Ship: It is customary to provide gratuities for your cabin steward, server, and cocktail server. A suggested



gratuity equivalent to the amount of 13 Euros per person per day is added to your shipboard account to cover all relevant staff members. Should the service either exceed or not meet your expectations, you may request to adjust this amount at the end of the cruise.

Internet Aboard Ship: As part of your cruise package, Holiday Vacations has included wireless Internet connection. Please be aware that the Internet connection on board may be weaker in particular areas and will not be up to the standard of a hotel Internet connection. Failures in these onboard systems may occur as borders are frequently crossed during cruises. Internet reception is poor while transiting the locks and may not be available in certain locations along the route

Laundry Aboard Ship: Valet laundry service and ironing service is available onboard the riverboat for a fee. Travel irons are not allowed in staterooms. Dry cleaning is not available onboard.

Meals on Your Own: The suggested gratuity for wait staff serving non-included meals is approximately 10%.

Money Aboard Ship: The pricing for purchases aboard the vessel is in Euros. You will sign for your purchases, then settle your shipboard account in Euros with one convenient transaction at the end of the cruise whether by cash or credit card at the ship's reception desk. Visa, MasterCard, and American Express credit cards are accepted on the ship to settle your account. These credit cards are also generally accepted while in ports. If using cash for your onboard account, a deposit will be required.

Phones Aboard Ship: Cell phone coverage is intermittent. It is recommended that you contact your provider regarding accessibility and rates prior to departure. Your relatives and friends may contact you aboard the cruise ship by calling 011-43-664-812-9210 for the Amadeus Silver III. They will need to have a credit card, the ship name, and your name available when making the call. MasterCard and Visa are accepted.
